Everyone is invited to the Parish Centre after the 7.30pm Mass where tea will be served.

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL: A joint meeting of the Parish Pastoral Council and the Parish Finance Committee held last Monday agreed to a complete upgrade of the entire heating system in the church. Parts of the boiler have been removed to allow it function on a temporary basis for the moment. It continues to leak water and it is unreliable. It is estimated that another €100,000 will need to be raised to meet all the costs of upgrading the heating system. The meeting agreed to the following to raise funds: (1) Requesting parishioners to put whatever extra they can afford into the weekly Offertory collection (2) To see what grants may be available that could be applied for (3) To ask our diaspora spread around the world, who often tune into the Parish via the webcam, to support us in any way they can, (4) To work on the tax rebate scheme which allows charities to claim back the tax on donations made to them that reach €250 or more over the course of a year, (5) To seek fund-raising initiatives and suggestions from parishioners.

SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPELS - Mark 10:46-52

In this story Jesus cures the blind man, Bartimaeus. Recovery of sight in the Bible is often a metaphor for coming to faith. Perhaps during your life you have had moments of insight, of deeper understanding, of appreciating who Jesus is for you. What was it that helped you to see more clearly? Who was the 'Jesus person' who helped you to see more clearly? Perhaps, as a parent, a teacher, or a friend, you have also been a 'Jesus person' for another and helped her or him to a clearer understanding of the meaning of life, love, and faith. To get to Jesus, Bartimaeus threw aside his cloak so that he would not be impeded. What have you had to discard in order to be able to see more clearly, e.g. an assumption, a prejudice, a rigid opinion)? 'Your faith has saved you' Jesus said to Bartimaeus. Recall situations in which you have been grateful for the faith that is yours because in some way it saved you. - John Byrne OSA
