SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD: Sunday, November 25th, is the final Sunday in the Church's year. It is the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. To honour this day there will be Adoration in St. Joseph's Chapel from 3pm with a guided Holy Hour at the end from 6.30pm to 7.30pm. All parishioners are encouraged to participate in this time of prayer to thank the Lord for so many blessings this past Church year, and to invoke his blessing anew in our own lives. May each and all open themselves to the teaching, life and rule of our Universal King, Jesus Christ, God's suffering Servant.

HOLY HOUR: A directed Holy Hour will take place in the Church during the Sundays of Advent from 6.30pm - 7.30pm, beginning next Sunday, December 2nd. It is a time to prepare spiritually for Christmas and to pray God's blessings on our families, the Church and the world.

ALL-NIGHT VIGIL AT KNOCK SHRINE: The annual All-night Vigil will take place at Knock Shrine on Friday 7th-Saturday 8th December. The Vigil Ceremonies will commence with Confessions from 10pm in the Chapel of Reconciliation and Vigil at 12 midnight on Fri, 7th in the Basilica with Rosary, Stations of the Cross and Holy Hour with Fr. Brendan Walsh, SCA. Concelebrated Mass will take place at 4am with His Excellency Archbishop Okolo, Papal Nuncio. JOURNEY INTO ADVENT: Advent begins on Sunday, 2nd December. To prepare ourselves for this special Church season before Christmas our Cluster have organised one evenings reflection in the Pastoral Centre in Charlestown led by Fr. Pat Lynch, Kiltimagh. It will be on Monday, 26th November at 8pm. Join us on this evening as we prepare for Advent and Christmas.

FIRST SATURDAYS DEVOTION is being hosted in Knock Old Parish Church on Saturday 1st Dec. Starts at 11am with Rosary, meditations and concludes with Holy Mass at 12 noon, Confessions and enrollment of the free brown scapulars. Everyone is invited to attend to benefit from Our Lady's heavenly promises.

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL & FINANCE COMMITTEE:

The meeting on Monday last focused on the following: Heating System - Three options are being considered; (1) To renew existing system but changing from oil to gas. (2) Air heating system coming from back of Church fuelled by gas. (3) Renewable energy with gas boiler as backup. A final decision will be based on the fact that the Church is classified a Protected Structure, and its implications on what can be done; that the heating system will be adequate, given the nature of the Church building, and that it will be as cost-effective as possible.

(2) The renewal of the heating is part of the ongoing refurbishment of the Church that will be necessary over the coming years. It is estimated that the total cost will be at least in the region of €500,000. (a) The meeting agreed to introduce a second box of weekly envelopes for this purpose in addition to the weekly Offertory box already in use from the start of 2019. It was decided to take them up in a second basket collection towards the end of Mass. This will make a clear distinction with the offertory collection for all the day-to-day needs of the parish and of which 25% goes to the running of the Diocese. A decision was made to begin a second collection next weekend, the start of the new Church year.

Parishioners are requested to contribute whatever they can while maintaining their usual Offertory contribution. When envelopes become available please use them as they will be of help with the following fund-raising initiative.

(b) Tax Rebate Scheme: The donations made to the Parish by PAYE and self-employed workers are part of their taxable income. The Parish can claim back the tax paid on them if the donor gives permission to do so. It involves providing a PPS number and signing a Revenue Charity form and return it to the Parochial House. There must be a contribution of at least €250 over the year and evidence that it was made. This does not affect the donors tax position in any way, and no correspondence will be entered into by the Revenue. Details & form accompanying newsletter this weekend are on Church noticeboards and Revenue.ie under Charities Donation Scheme.

(3) The annual Carol Service on will take place on Tuesday, 18th December at 7.30pm in the parish Church. The Christmas collection in aid of St. Vincent de Paul will take place at this Carol service, as is done every year.

(4) Christmas night Mass takes place on Monday December 24th at 9pm in the parish Church.
