PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL & FINANCE COMMITTEE MEETING: At the joint meeting on Monday night last, it was decided that the best option for heating the nave of the church is to place radiators beneath every second seat on both sides of the centre aisles. They will not interfere with kneeling and will mean that the seats in the nave will stay as they are. The seats on both sides of the church will need to be shortened to facilitate new radiators along the walls. Placing the radiators beneath the seats will add to the cost but it was considered the most appropriate option for the church. Further updates will be available over the coming weeks on how work will proceed and the costs involved.

SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE EYES OF THE GOSPEL - Luke 6:27-38

1) Our natural tendency when attacked is to protect ourselves; when we are attacked, we attack back. We respond to an angry word with another, or to a blow by hitting back. Here, Jesus suggests that at times there may be another way to act. What has been your experience of retaliation? Has it been life-giving? Have you experience of another way of acting?

2) When we do good to another, it can sometimes be in return for what we have received. At other times it can be done in the hope of getting something back. Or we may do it simply for the sake of doing good without any strings attached. Jesus suggests that this is when we are at our best. Recall your experience of these different ways of giving and celebrate the occasions when you gave without expectation of return.

3) Jesus proposes the generosity of God as a model for our generosity, and says that the generous will be rewarded.

Perhaps you have experienced rewards, even in this life, from generous behaviour.

INTRODUCTORY RITES: THE PENITENTIAL ACT: This time in the Mass offers us an opportunity to prepare to receive Eucharist by reflecting on the things that we might have done during the past week for which we need forgiveness. We are reminded that God always loves us. One of the ways in which God shows this love is by always forgiving us of those times when we haven't been as good as we might have been. There are different kinds of prayers that the priest can use at this part of the Mass. These prayers do two things. They help us to remember the times when we haven't been as good as we might have been. More importantly, they remind us of God's love for us. Sometimes the priest may replace the Penitential Act with the blessing and sprinkling of water as a reminder of our Baptism.
