## SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPEL Mt. 25:31-46 (Intercom)

1. This judgement scene contains surprises for us. One surprise is that nobody is condemned for doing wrong, but for their failure to do good. Being a disciple of Jesus is a positive choice about how we live and relate to others. Perhaps sin-avoidance has sometimes dominated your view of what was being asked of you. What difference has it made for you when you viewed your Christian life as a daily opportunity to make a positive difference to others? 2. Another way of saying this is that the aim of Christian living is not me-centered (about my personal satisfaction) but other-centered (about responding to the needs of others). What happens to you when you get caught up in yourself? Is your life not better, and often more enjoyable, when you can look beyond yourself to others? 3. Another surprise is to hear Jesus tell us that when we do something for another, he considers it done to himself. When has seeing Christ in others helped you in your dealings with them? 4. The story is about the judgement of the whole of humanity. It presents an ideal of society in which human relationships at all levels are governed by the law of love. In your experience what difference has it made to a group to which you belong when there was a definite sensitivity to the needs of all members?

### FAMILY PRAYER TIME (Loyola Press)

In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches us that we will be judged on only one thing: the acts of mercy we have shown to the least among us. Jesus identifies with the least ones; thus we serve Jesus whenever we serve one of the least ones. The Church calls the actions that Jesus described in today's Gospel the Corporal Works of Mercy. These works are to feed the hungry, to clothe the naked, to bury the dead, to shelter the homeless, to visit the sick and imprisoned, and to give alms to the poor. In these actions we show God's compassion and mercy to those in need.

As you gather as a family, recall the list of the Corporal Works of Mercy. Talk about some concrete examples of how your family might do these actions in your community and then discuss why it is important that we do these things. Read Matthew 25:31-46. Ask Why does Jesus say we ought to do these works of mercy? Because whenever we show mercy to another person, we show mercy to Jesus himself.

Choose one Corporal Work of Mercy that your family will act upon this week. Pray together that your family will see and serve Jesus in the least ones among us. Pray the Lord's Prayer together.

### CHILDRENS' CORNER (Loyola Press)

We know which actions are loving and generous and which are not. For example, we know the difference between sharing with a friend and ignoring a friend. But knowing isn't enough. We need to act in generous ways. In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches us that God knows who chooses to serve him by being loving and generous to others. When we care for others, especially those who are most in need, Jesus says that we are caring for him. People who follow Jesus and perform loving and generous acts for others will one day live with him forever. Let us care for one another to show that we are Jesus' loving and generous disciples. Conclude by praying all together The Lord's Prayer.
