MASSES THIS WEEKEND - SATURDAY / SUNDAY 26th/27th September

This weekend's 7.30pm and 11am Masses are confined to estates, streets and townlands from A-D. Please respect areas for each weekend. If you attend Mass during the week, please leave the church free for others to attend Mass at the weekend. Church spaces will be allocated on a first come basis. It is highly recommended that in all indoor settings a face mask is worn.

(1) Only 50 people are permitted to be in the church, in accordance with Government guidelines.

(2) Because of the limitation of numbers, it may be only family members that can be present at some Masses for first anniversaries or Month's Mind mass. (This will be subject to change in line with guidelines)

(3) Everyone is asked to please maintain the 2 meter distance as marked on the tarmacadam once you enter the church grounds, and to follow the directions of stewards.

(4) You are asked to remain in your seat as Holy Communion will be distributed to you there.

(5) Please leave your seat row by row, at the end of Mass.

Anyone remaining at home for the time being who wish to receive Holy Communion at the weekend, please contact the Parochial House to arrange for a Minister of the Eucharist to do so.

9.30 am SUNDAY MASS in Parish Church The Parish Pastoral Council and Finance Committee have agreed to have a 9.30am Mass on Sunday mornings in the Church as the Craggagh Mass remains temporarily suspended. This is on a trial basis in the hope of giving more people, especially families, the opportunity to be present at Mass. It will commence on Sunday, 4th October. Numbers will continue to be 50 at each Mass.

From the weekend of Oct 3rd/4th, Saturday evening Mass and the two Sunday Masses will be open to the whole parish and not just to particular areas as has been the case.

SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPEL: Matthew 21:28-32

1. It is possible to be a dutiful and observant Christian, and yet feel there is something missing. Does it not make a huge difference when your heart is in what you are doing? It is so much better than just going through the motions. Where do you experience that most in your life? 2. The desire of Jesus for us is that we grow in that kind of committed, enthusiastic involvement in life. What encourages you to grow in this way? Recall times when your relationship with God, or with another person, was something that gave you energy, hope or joy. What lessons do you learn from these memories? 3. The elders probably thought well of themselves in contrast to the tax collectors and sinners. Perhaps you know some unconventional people, ones who appear to ignore the 'right' way of doing things, and yet they have taught you something about true goodness.

FAMILY PRAYER TIME

The example Jesus poses in today's Gospel could have been taken directly from family experience. Each of us can recall instances in which family members spoke one thing but then did another. The point of Jesus' story is to show that our actions speak louder than words, even with God. As you gather as a family, talk about times when a family member said one thing and then did another. Acknowledge that sometimes the action taken displays a true change of heart. Then read today's Gospel, Matthew 21:28-32. Observe that Jesus faulted the religious leaders for not allowing John the Baptist's message of repentance to change their hearts and actions. The word we sometimes use for this change of heart is *conversion*. Jesus wants us to do more than pay lip service to the Gospel; he wants us to be transformed by his word. Pray together that your family will experience a conversion to God and show evidence of this in both actions and words. Pray together today's second reading, Philippians 2:1-5. (Loyola Press)

CHILDREN'S CORNER

In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches us that it is important that we are consistent in our words and our actions. Listen carefully to what he says. The father asked his two sons to work in the vineyard. What did the first son do? He said no, but then changed his mind and went to work. What did the other son do? He said yes, but then didn't do the work. Which son did what his father asked? The first son. Sometimes when we are asked to do something, we might say yes and then forget. Other times, we might have no plans to do what we are asked. We say yes, but we don't mean it. Jesus teaches us that our actions are as important as our words. We are called to love and obey God in our words and in our actions. Take a moment and think of a commitment you will keep this week.
