The church is again available for private prayer from 11.45am on weekdays and from 1pm on Sundays. Please always sanitize your hands on entering and leaving the church and use the wipes available to sanitize anything touched or sat upon during your visit to the church.

MASSES THIS WEEKEND - SATURDAY / SUNDAY 18th/19th JULY

This week's 7.30pm and 11am Masses are confined to estates, streets and townlands from A-D (Aiden Street - Devlesh). Church spaces will be allocated on a first come basis.

- (1) Only 50 people are permitted to be in the church, in accordance with Government guidelines.
- (2) Because of the limitation of numbers, it may be only family members that can be present at some Masses for first anniversaries or Month's Mind mass. (This will be subject to change in line with guidelines)
- (3) Please do not take offence if no space is available. Friday evening Mass at 7.30pm is available along with morning Mass at 10am for those free to attend during the week.
- (4) Everyone is asked to please maintain the 2 meter distance as marked on the tarmacadam once you enter the church grounds, and to follow the directions of stewards.
- (5) Please sanitize your hands on entering and leaving the church, using the sanitizer provided near the church door.
- (6) Please use the MAIN door for entering the church. Both doors will be used for exiting the church.
- (7) If it is necessary for someone to enter the church via the side door, that will be facilitated.
- (8) Please respect the guidance given by church authorities that Holy Communion be received in the hand only during this period of time to honour the Lord and care for our neighbour.
- (9) You are asked to remain in your seat as Holy Communion will be distributed to you there.
- (10) Dispensation from the Sunday and Holy Day obligations is extended for the time being. It is most important that people that are vulnerable or unwell, and especially those with any symptoms that might suggest Covid-19 infection, should stay at home and, if possible, participate as they do now, via webcam, social media, television or radio. The same applies to those who have been in recent contact with someone who had the virus, in accordance with public health advice.
- (11) Please note that the Choir is suspended until further notice.

Anyone remaining at home for the time being who wish to receive Holy Communion at the weekend, please contact the Parochial House to arrange for a Minister of the Eucharist to do so.

FAMILY PRAYER TIME: Taken together, the parables found in today's Gospel offer both a sobering reminder about the Kingdom of God and words of encouragement. As the wheat and the weeds must grow together until the harvest, so we may not know whether our actions contribute to God's Kingdom until God's final judgement. With the word of caution in mind, we act always in prayer that our actions will be consistent with God's plan. In the parables of the mustard seed and the yeast, we hear words of encouragement. God can bring the Kingdom of Heaven from even the smallest of beginnings. Thus, we ask God to work through us for the sake of the Kingdom of Heaven. Set aside some time this week to make bread with your family. Show the amount of yeast that is required to raise an entire batch of bread. Observe that little things can go a long way. After the bread has been baked, gather together as a family. Read together today's Gospel, Matthew 13:24-43. Reflect together on what Jesus means when he teaches that the kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed and like yeast. In these parables, Jesus is teaching us that God can work wonders from even the smallest beginnings of the Kingdom of God. This means that even the little things that we do can make a big difference in the lives of others. What are some of the little things that we can do as a family that help to make things better for others? Decide on one action to take together. Pray that God will use your action to make a difference in the world. Pray together the Lord's Prayer (Loyola Press)

CHILDREN'S CORNER

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells three parables. The first is called the Parable of the Sower, and in it the farmer allows the wheat and the weeds to grow together. In the second parable, Jesus taught that the Kingdom of Heaven is like a mustard seed. In the third parable, he said that the Kingdom of Heaven is like yeast. In the parable of the mustard seed and the parable of the yeast, Jesus is teaching us that little things can make a big difference. In fact, the Kingdom of Heaven, the great news that Jesus came to announce, begins with the smallest of actions. That means that every good thing that we do, however small, can have tremendous effect when we do it because we love Jesus.



SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPEL: Matthew 13:24-43

1. The owner of the field who allowed the wheat and the darnel to grow together is a reminder to us to be patient with ourselves and with others when we see that not everything is right. Sometimes a preoccupation with the negative (the darnel) can blind us to the positive in our own lives and in the lives of others. When have you found that a willingness to live with the messiness of the present created the conditions for future growth? 2. Have you ever found that it was through accepting the darnel that you learned important lessons for life, e.g., learning through mistakes, stupid questions, or foolish risks? 3. The parables of the mustard seed and the leaven are reminders that seemingly insignificant things can have very positive results. Have you ever been surprised by the benefit to yourself or others of a kind gesture, a small initiative, or a word of encouragement? (Intercom)
