## CHILDREN'S CORNER (Loyola Press)

When we think only about ourselves, we keep everything we have. When we think of others, we share what we have. In today's Gospel, Jesus invites us to share what we have with others. Does the man think about others or only about himself? (Only about himself) He has plenty of things to keep himself happy, but he hasn't shared any of his wealth with people in need. We ask God to forgive us for what we have done, and we also ask him to forgive us for what we have failed to do. When we fail to share what we have with others, especially those who have less than we do, we have committed a sin of omission. We are acting like the man in the parable. Pray the Lord's prayer to ask God's help to share. Our Father...

## FAMILY PRAYER TIME: (Loyola Press)

Family life helps us learn about the values of solidarity and the common good. As a family, we strive to respect the rights of each family member and make decisions that promote the common good of the family. Talk about what it would be like if the family ordered a pizza and then divided it unevenly, with some members getting as many pieces as they wanted while others got only a half slice. Talk about how you work to make sure that everyone in the family has his or her fair share. Talk about how your family is also a member of the human family, called to share the goods of creation fairly and justly. Explain that in this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus challenges us to remember that the goods of the world are intended to be shared by all. Read aloud Luke 12:13-21. Talk about the parable of the rich fool and ask family members to describe what they think he did wrong. Emphasize that although the man in the story doesn't seem bad, Jesus points out that this man's flaw was that he was thinking only about himself and his own comfort and security. Emphasize that when we fail to think about the needs of others, we call that a sin of omission. Remind your children that each time we go to Mass, we ask forgiveness for what we have done and for what we have failed to do. We call this prayer the Confiteor. End this time together by praying the Confiteor ("I confess to almighty God...").

## SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH LENS OF THE GOSPEL - Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

One's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions', said Jesus. What have you found by experience to be more important in life than possessions? What brought this home to you?

'Be on your guard against all kinds of greed'. Perhaps you have seen how greed can lead to trouble in public life, in family life, and in the personal life of individuals. What has helped you to guard against greed? What benefits have you experienced when you were less greedy?

The message of the parable could be summed up in saying 'If you want to give God a laugh, tell him your plans'. Life takes many twists and turns we do not anticipate. When have you found that you had to change your plans because of unexpected circumstances? What has helped you to be flexible and resourceful at such times?
