PUBLIC CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST

Under new Government guidelines that came into effect from 22nd Oct, 2021 churches can have congregation at full capacity with all other protective measures remaining in place. This requires not attending if having symptoms of Covid, sanitizing hands, the wearing of masks and social distancing as appropriate. Holy Communion will be distributed by coming forward to the Sanctuary area, and on the hand. Those in side aisles are requested to come forward in aisle along the wall and return by next aisle, leaving appropriate space. Those in main aisle are requested to alternate between right and left seats so that there is only a single line coming forward and to return by next aisle leaving appropriate distance between themselves and also those of side aisles returning to their seats. Masks to be worn processing for Holy Communion and returning to seats. Those in St. Joseph's Chapel are requested to come forward in the wall aisle close to the Chapel and return in the next aisle. Holy Communion will be brought to anyone for whom it is not possible to come forward. Thank you again to all stewards for their great assistance during the past year and a half, and to our sacristan James, for keeping interior of the church and all it's contents thoroughly sanitized as well as keeping the necessary supplies in place.

A PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING took place on Tuesday, 16th November at 7.30pm in St. Joseph's Chapel where it was decided to leave a decision on Christmas Masses until it's December meeting. Appreciation was expressed at the return of the choir who led the congregation so well in song on its first day back. Thanks was also expressed to Richella O'Connor for stepping in as organist. Members agreed to go ahead with advertising for Organist/Choir Director in the near future. The meeting was also informed that architects will bring forward proposals and costs for dealing with dampness in the church in the new year.

BAPTISM: We welcome into the Christian community CADHLA MAI McBRINE who was recently baptised in Kiltimagh Church.

St. COLUMBAN: We celebrate St. Columban on 23rd November. Columba, known also as Columbanus and Colombán, was born in Leinster, Ireland in 543. He became a monk in Bangor under the Abbott Comgall. Around the age of 45 he left his homeland with a group of companions to continue his missionary journey as a Pilgrim of Christ across continental Europe. He ended his earthly pilgrimage in Bobbio, northern Italy in 615.

A founder of monasteries and communities, healer, prophet, and missionary, he has inspired peoples throughout the centuries to focus on their life's journey and embrace the call to follow Christ. O Lord, grant us that love which can never die, which will enkindle our lamps but not extinguish them, so that they may shine in us and bring light to others. Most dear Saviour, enkindle our lamps that they may shine forever in your temple. May we receive unquenchable light from you so that our darkness will be illuminated and the darkness of the world will be made less. Amen.

SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPEL - 34th Sunday - CHRIST THE KING (Intercom)

1. The feast we have today, and the Gospel, give us an opportunity to reflect on the different ways in which we, and others, exercise influence and leadership. The authority of Pilate came from position and power. The authority of Jesus came from his integrity and what he stood for. Recall leaders you have known whose influence was like that of Jesus (teachers, community leaders, family members). 2. The values of the kingdom of God cannot be imposed. It is never a matter of fighting battles, or forcing others into compliance. Perhaps through experience you have learned the limitations of the use of force, as a parent, a teacher, a group leader. What has been the good news, the learning for you, in this?

FAMILY PRAYER (Loyola Press) Understanding today's feast of Christ the King may be particularly challenging. While most of us do not have direct experience with kings or royalty, we have a sense of who they are. We know that royalty have sovereignty over their kingdoms. We know that those who are subjects to royalty offer them allegiance and honour. To understand how Christ is our king, we extend and magnify what we know to be true of the best of human royalty. Christ's kingship extends to all places, all people, and all times. Christ manifests his kingship through his death on the cross in which he offered salvation to everyone. Those who can see with eyes of faith recognise Jesus to be our heavenly king. As you gather as a family, recall that this Sunday is the last Sunday in the Church year and on this Sunday we celebrate the feast of Christ the King. Talk together about what it means to be a king or queen. How do those who are subjects behave toward royalty? Invite children to role-play what one does in the presence of royalty. Read today's Gospel, John 18:33b-37 Ask your family to discuss these questions: Does Pilate treat Jesus like royalty? (No.) What does Jesus say about his kingdom? (It is not of this world) Talk about how your family shows honour and obedience to Christ the King. Pray together the Lords Prayer and ask God to help your family act in ways that show you recognise and honour Christ the King.

CHILDRENS CORNER (Loyola Press) Today is the Feast of Christ the King. We call Jesus our King, but his is not like the kings and queens of countries. He is a different kind of king. In today's Gospel, Pontius Pilate asks Jesus if he is a king. How does Jesus respond? (Jesus told Pontius Pilate that his kingdom did not belong to this world). Jesus was not an earthly king. He is the king of Heaven, our Lord and Saviour. He came to teach us the truth about God the Father's love and forgiveness, and to save us from our sins. He shows us how to live. Prayer to Jesus our King: 'Jesus, you are the King of Heaven. Help us to live in love, truth and peace, just as you have taught us to live.' Pray the prayer Christ the King taught us: Our Father.....
