ST. NATHY (6th Century): Along with Saint Attracta, St Nathy is patron of our diocese of Achonry. Achonry (Irish Achadh Chonaire, "the field of Conaire") is a village between Ballymote and Tubbercurry in Co Sligo. A pupil of St Finian of Clonard, St Nathy had a reputation for holiness. St Finian put him in charge of a monastery at Achonry. It is probably for this reason that, sometime after the diocese was formally erected at the Synod of Kells in 1152, Nathy was named as the patron of Achonry diocese that includes parishes from the counties of Sligo, east Mayo and north-west Roscommon.

ST. ATTRACTA (5th Century) Attracta is reputed to have been a contemporary of St Patrick, to whom she made her profession in Coolavin near Lough Gara in south Co Sligo. St Patrick is said to have founded a nunnery there and appointed Attracta its first abbess. Her convent had a reputation for hospitality and charity to the poor. The convent was situated in what is now the old cemetery at Killaraght (Cill Adhracht = Attracta's Church) between Monasteraden and Boyle. It is in the parish of Gurteen, Co Sligo, and there are historical references to it from the 5th century down to 1594.

CHILDREN'S CORNER (Loyola Press)

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells us that we need to be alert disciples. Let's pay attention to learn what we need to be alert for. Jesus wants us to be alert for his return. Jesus has saved us, but we should not just sit back and do nothing. He teaches us that we should pay attention to others and notice how we can help them. That way, when Jesus returns, he will find us acting as his loving disciples. Let's all plan to pay special attention to how we can help our family and friends today. Conclude by praying together the Our Father.

FAMILY PRAYER TIME (Loyola Press)

Years ago, most families had only one or two clocks in their home. Today, we have clocks everywhere—on our walls, on our microwave ovens, on our cell phones, and so on. As a family, go through the house and count how many clocks (time-telling devices) your family has. Talk about important events for which family members need to be on time. Recall experiences of being late for something, either as individuals or as a family. Explain that in this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus talks about how important it is for us to be aware and alert, otherwise, we will miss something. Read aloud Luke 12:32-48. Talk about the parable that Jesus told and discuss how the master will feel if he arrives to find his servant doing his job. Discuss what our job is as disciples of Jesus. Explain that, just as we need to be aware of the time so that we don't miss anything important, we also need to be alert and focused on our jobs, our responsibilities as followers of Jesus. Encourage each family member to place a sacred symbol near the clock that they use most in the house and to use the symbol and the clock as a reminder that it is always "time" for us to be acting like disciples of Christ.

SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH LENS OF THE GOSPEL - Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Intercom)

The opening verses of this gospel invite us to ask ourselves what do we see as our purpose in life? What are our priorities? Is our heart set on material progress and advance, or do we have other priorities? What has helped you to appreciate that there is more to your life than earthly possessions and success?

At times one can sense in Jesus an urgency, as if he wanted to shake people and wake them up to take his words seriously. The parable has that tone: 'Be dressed for action and have your lamps lit'. When have you found that being alert enabled you to grasp a moment of opportunity that you might easily have missed, e.g., when a child or friend gave a hint that they would like to talk, and a very meaningful conversation ensued.

Another consideration that adds to the sense of urgency in the words of Jesus is that we only have one life, and we do not know how long that will last. So, Jesus calls us on us to live in the now and to treasure our time. Sometimes we can drift aimlessly through a day, and on other occasions use a day purposefully. What difference does that make, if any, to how you experience the day?
