PUBLIC CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST

Under new Government guidelines that came into effect from 22nd Oct, 2021 churches can have congregation at full capacity with all other protective measures remaining in place. This requires not attending if having symptoms of Covid, sanitizing hands, the wearing of masks and social distancing as appropriate. Holy Communion will be distributed by coming forward to the Sanctuary area, and on the hand. Those in side aisles are requested to come forward in aisle along the wall and return by next aisle, leaving appropriate space. Those in main aisle are requested to alternate between right and left seats so that there is only a single line coming forward and to return by next aisle leaving appropriate distance between themselves and also those of side aisles returning to their seats. Masks to be worn processing for Holy Communion and returning to seats. Those in St. Joseph's Chapel are requested to come forward in the wall aisle close to the Chapel and return in the next aisle. Holy Communion will be brought to anyone for whom it is not possible to come forward. Thank you again to all stewards for their great assistance during the past year and a half, and to our sacristan James, for keeping interior of the church and all it's contents thoroughly sanitized as well as keeping the necessary supplies in place.

PRAYER FOR THOSE SUFFERING FROM DEPRESSION (Poor Clares, Galway (poorclares.ie)) Lord, you know the darkness that envelops me. This cloud descends on me and, when it does, I seem to lose all perspective. It seems like it will never lift. I know I have pulled out of it before, but when it starts again, it clouds everything. Help me to trust in you in this difficult time. I know that after the rain, the sun shines again and that above the clouds, the sun is always shining. But please impress this conviction in my heart so that your gift of hope will carry me through. I believe that you can heal me and so I entrust myself to you. Give me the graces I need to 'hang in there' until your healing love, which I know is constantly working in me, finally penetrates and gives me the relief that I need. Amen. Out of his infinite glory, may he give you the power through his Spirit for your hidden self to grow strong. Eph. 3:16

SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPEL - 33rd Sunday (Intercom) 1. Jesus speaks of the established order falling apart, but the collapse of the old order opened the way for new possibilities. Our church is in crisis, and the world is facing climate disaster. Where have you seen something new and hopeful emerge in the midst of all this, e.g., some action arising from better eco awareness (less waste, a community garden et al)? 2. The parable of the fig tree - Even in winter it begins to put forth leaves which give a hint of the fruit to come. Where have you found signs of hope in a wintry situation - in your own life, in the life of some group, in the life of the church, in our world? 3. Jesus proposes no clear time-scale for the events being foretold, so the final sentence (v.32) is a call to alertness, to live the present to the full. What difference does it make to you when you are able to live the present moment to the full?

FAMILY PRAYER (Loyola Press) Many things in our lives and in our world are subject to change. Yet all of us find security in relationships and values that endure. Foremost among these are our family relationships. We can confidently accept change if we know that we will continue to be loved by our family and by God. We help impart this sense of trust and confidence in our children with our daily assurances to them that nothing can change our love for them. As you gather as a family, look through several family photo albums. Observe and talk about things that have changed in your family life over the years. Talk about the things that have stayed the same. We do not need to fear changes in our family life because we know that the most important aspects of our family life do not change, such as our love for one another. The same is true with God and God's love for us. Read today's Gospel, Mark 13:24-32. Jesus teaches us that things in our world will change and that the world itself will one day end. We don't need to be fearful because God's love will never end. Pray together, thanking God for his never-ending love for us and say the 'Glory Be To The Father.'

CHILDRENS CORNER (Loyola Press) Our world is changing. We see many changes throughout the year. We know spring is coming when we see buds on the trees. The days start to get longer, and the weather gets warmer as summer approaches. Ask: What happens that tells us autumn is coming? (The days get shorter, cooler, and the leaves turn orange and brown). What sign tells us winter has arrived? (It is colder. It might snow. Some trees lose their leaves.) In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us about another change that will happen one day. He tells of signs that will let us know that change is coming. What are the signs Jesus gave? (The sun and moon will be darkened, stars will fall from the sky, Christ will come again and send angels) Jesus teaches us that our world changes and will one day end. But we do not have to be afraid of change. Jesus' love for us will never end. His words are true, and he is always with us. Conclude by praying the 'Our Father.'
