WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY: 18-25 January. The theme for the 2022 Week of Prayer is 'We saw the star in the East, and we came to worship him' (Mt 2:2), taken from the account of the visit of the magi to pay homage to the infant king (Mt 2:2-12). It is a call to unity, of those from the North and the South, from the East and from the West, old and young, men and women.

SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD: On September 30, 2019 on the liturgical memorial of St. Jerome, Pope Francis announced that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time would be celebrated as the Sunday of the Word of God. This year it will fall on Sunday next, January 23rd, 2022. It is to help 'reawaken an awareness of the importance of Sacred Scripture in our lives as believers.' All Ministers of the Word in our parish are requested to renew their commissioning from their seats following the homily at either the 7.30pm, 9.30am or 11am Masses next weekend.

FAMILY PRAYER: (Loyola Press)

Weddings are wonderful family celebrations. We go out of our way to make the occasion festive and extraordinary. People work hard to please one another. What better image of the Kingdom of God! Not every day is a wedding celebration, but we can anticipate the Kingdom of God each day in our attentiveness to one another's needs. If your family has attended a wedding celebration together, talk about the experience and the planning and cooperation that make the celebration memorable. Talk about how weddings and feasts are images in Scripture for the Kingdom of God. Consider how these festive occasions are images of God's tremendous love for us and examples of how we can show our love for one another. Then read together today's Gospel, John 2:1-11. Talk about Jesus' response. What could your family learn from this story? Consider ways that you might show these values in your family's daily life. Pray together Saint Ignatius' Prayer for Generosity: *Eternal Word, only begotten Son of God, teach me true generosity. Teach me to serve you as you deserve, to give without counting the cost, to fight heedless of wounds, to labour without seeking rest, to sacrifice myself without thought of any reward, save the knowledge that I have done your will. Amen.*

SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPEL - 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time (Intercom)

1. The story is a story of abundance, the abundance of the blessings God gives us. How have you been aware of the abundance of God's blessings? Let the memories lead you to prayer of thanks and praise for the times in your life when that joy and fulfilment have been very real to you.
2. The house of Jesus had not yet come when the glory of God would be fully revealed, yet even so, something of the glory of God was revealed in the sign that took place. For us also the revelation of the full glory of God lies in the future, but we do get glimpses along the way. Recall some of the signs that have revealed to you something of the glory of God, e.g. nature, art, friendship, etc.
3. Mary/Jesus. It is interesting to note that despite the apparent rebuff, Mary is the first person in the narrative to show (at the level of the action of the story) that the correct response to the presence of Jesus is to trust in him. When have you trusted in the word of Jesus like that? What relationships do you have that you can trust like that? Do you recall times when your trust was rewarded even when you had been initially disappointed?

CHILDRENS CORNER (Loyola Press)

Everyone needs help from time to time. As children of God, we are called to help those in need. When we see a need, we try to help. Today we will hear a story about Jesus and his mother, Mary. They go to a wedding. Mary notices that the people have run out of something. What did they run out of? (wine). Mary asks Jesus to help. He tells the people to fill the jars with water. Then what does he do? (He turns the water into wine). Jesus gives them more than they need. He teaches us that God is always with us and responds to our needs. When we see a need, we can try to help. What are some ways you help your friends and family? We can pray for God to help others. Let's take a moment to think of people who need God's help. Keep them in your heart as you pray. Pray that God will help all those in need and hear your prayer for them as you pray the 'Our Father'.
