PUBLIC CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

Under the present public health guidelines we are able to have two sections of 50 persons each in our church. Section A entrance/exit is the side door facing the Parochial House and Section B entrance/exit is the church's Main Door. There can be no intermingling of the two sections. Social distancing of 2 meters within sections, wearing face masks if at all possible, and hand sanitizing are to be observed. Members of the same household can be together in seat but different households need to be 2 meters apart if in same seat. Holy Communion will continue to be distributed in the seats and on the hand. Choir is not permitted at this time. Thank you to stewards for their great assistance and to our sacristan, James, for keeping the interior of the church and all it's contents thoroughly sanitized and as well as keeping necessary supplies up to date.

THE NATIVITY OF JOHN THE BAPTIST - June 24th: We rejoice at the birth of St. John the Baptist, a man of self-denial, integrity of life and purpose, and an uncompromising prophetic voice. John means 'The Lord has shown favour'. This feast relates to the summer solstice, when the days begin to grow shorter, recalling John's words, 'He must increase, but I must decrease'.

POPE'S INTENTION FOR JUNE: The beauty of Marriage: Let us pray for young people who are preparing for marriage with the support of a Christian community: may they grow in love, with generosity, faithfulness and patience.

FAMILY PRAYER TIME (Loyola Press)

Worries and concerns are part of human life. Jesus teaches us, however, that we ought not to let worries and concerns consume us. Jesus teaches us that our faith ought to lead us to trust in God's protection and love, no matter how strong the whirlwind going on around us. Like the disciples, we can bring our worries and concerns to Jesus in prayer. Jesus will hear our cries for help. He knows that our faith can be fragile and he will act so that our trust in God will be strengthened. As you gather as a family, invite each family member to talk about something that might be worrying them. Talk about how important it is to share worries and concerns with other people. When we do this, we learn to see our worries from a different perspective. Read today's Gospel, Mark 4:35-41. Ask your family questions such as these: Why were the disciples worried about the storm? Why wasn't Jesus worried about the storm? When we bring our worries to Jesus in prayer, Jesus can help us see things from God's perspective. Invite family members to name again a worry or concern and pray together that Jesus will help us have faith in God's love and protection. Conclude in prayer together by praying the Lord's Prayer.

12th Sunday in Ordinary time - SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPEL (Intercom)

1. The image of a boat in a stormy sea is a symbol of life in difficult times and can represent inner turmoil, anxiety and high emotions. When you have been in such circumstances, perhaps a 'Jesus person' came to your assistance and calmed you down? Recall that person with gratitude.
2. The image can also be applied to a family, a community, a parish, or any other group. Remember people who have had a gift of bringing peace to troubled situations.
3. The significance of miracles in the Gospels is that they show Jesus as one who brings God's power to bear on human need and suffering. Have there been times when you have been a channel for this healing power of God, holding a crying child in your arms, calming the anxiety of a friend, or being a peacemaker in a group to which you belong?

CHILDRENS CORNER (CAFOD)

If you had been one of the disciples on that boat, with the wind blowing and the waves crashing, do you think you would have trusted Jesus that everything would be ok? Sometimes when everything around us is scary and going wrong, it can be hard to keep our faith in God. We can feel like God is no longer with us and it is hard to see how things will get better. But in this reading Jesus tells the disciples not to be afraid. They should know that God is always with them, especially in the difficult times. God works through us and through others who are there to help and support us in difficult times. Who makes you feel better when you are sad or frightened? The next time that you are sad, or afraid, let us remember that we are never alone. God is always with us. Let us try to see God in those who make us laugh and be happy, or who help us when we are frightened - our friends, our family, our teachers... Pray the Our Father, placing ourselves and others in God's care.
