PUBLIC CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

Under the present public health guidelines we are able to have two sections of 50 persons each in our church. Section A entrance/exit is the side door facing the Parochial House and Section B entrance/exit is the church's Main Door. There can be no intermingling of the two sections. Social distancing of 2 meters within sections, wearing face masks if at all possible, and hand sanitizing are to be observed. Members of the same household can be together in seat but different households need to be 2 meters apart if in same seat. Holy Communion will continue to be distributed in the seats and on the hand. Choir is not permitted at this time. Thank you to stewards for their great assistance and to our sacristan, James, for keeping the interior of the church and all it's contents thoroughly sanitized and as well as keeping necessary supplies up to date.

PENTECOST: The church was made manifest to the world on the day of Pentecost by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. The gift of the Spirit ushers in a new era in the 'dispensation of the mystery' the ages of the Church, during which Christ manifests, makes present, and communicates his work of salvation through the liturgy of his church, 'until he comes' (CCC,1076). Today marks the end of the Easter season. The Easter candle, which has been burning since Easter will be set aside and used only if there is a baptism or a funeral. After Pentecost we continue what is called 'Ordinary Time' which simply means that the great feasts have ended, and we go back to reading the Synoptic Gospels and hearing Jesus' teachings and parables in the light of all we have celebrated during the Church's special season.

CONFIRMATION: We look forward to celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Autumn with the hope that Covid restrictions will have greatly eased by then. Bishop Paul has recorded a video message for the Confirmation Classes and their families to mark the celebration of Pentecost this weekend. Thank you to our schools and teachers for all they do in supporting our families and parish in handling on the gift of Faith and in preparing our young people for the sacraments.

NATIONAL SYNOD: In March 2021, the Irish Bishops Conference announced their intention to hold a National Synod within the next five years. The synod pathway that we will embark on invites us to journey together in discernment of what the Holy Spirit is saying to the people of God in Ireland at this time. The word 'synod' comes from the Greek word meaning 'way together'. Together we will seek to find the way forward on our missionary journey. The synodal pathway will be in three parts, the initial phase is a time of listening, consultation, discernment, and prayer. The second phase will be of planning. The third will be the meeting of the synod itself. In order to begin phase one the Bishops Conference is looking for feedback and submissions from parishes and people of faith, on what methods to adopt to facilitate the beginnings of the initial conversation. Submissions can be entered in the comment box provided on catholicbishops.ie, the website of the Irish Bishops Conference. Submissions must be made before Pentecost Sunday, 23rd May. We pray that this time may be a time of renewal and new hope for the Church in Ireland.

Come, Spirit of Reverence, and bless all children and young people to withstand the temptations that lead them away from a holy and happy life. May they have good examples in their homes, schools, and society, and become true witnesses to the love of God in the world.

Come, O Spirit of Fortitude, and strengthen all those who are married or contemplating marriage and encourage them in their vocation of service to the community. Strengthen also those who are separated and divorced, to have courage and remain in your care. Lead them to a future filled with hope.

Come, Holy Spirit, bless us and grant us the grace to put Christ at the centre of our lives and our families. Heal the hurting and wounded, that they may be whole in body, mind, and spirit.

CHILDRENS CORNER (Sermons4Kids)

No one can see the wind, but that doesn't mean it's not important. The wind helps us cool off when we get hot; it cleans the air from smog; and it can even be used to power our homes. What other things can you think of that the wind does? (Pause) God's Spirit is kind of like the wind. We can't see the Holy Spirit, but the Holy Spirit is very important and always with us. What is something else you can think of that you can't see but is still very important? (Pause) When God sent his Holy Spirit to be with His people, it was like a mighty, rushing wind. It's called the day of Pentecost. When the loud wind came, the disciples say what looked like tongues of fire came to rest on each of them, and all of them were filled with the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit helped them share God's message of love with everyone around by speaking other languages! When we believe, God puts His Holy Spirit in us, too.

SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPEL John 15:9-17 (Intercom)

1. Jesus recognised that his disciples were not capable of taking in everything at once. Wisdom about life comes slowly and sometimes painfully. Hearing the 'right' answer at the 'wrong' time does not help us. We need to be ready and open to receiving the truth if it is to have any impact. Perhaps you can recall some occasions when it was the 'right' time for you to learn a truth about life. Remember your experiences of growth in understanding. 2. The Spirit can guide us to understanding in different settings. Understanding may have come to you when you were praying or reflecting on your life. Perhaps the Spirit guided you through the words of someone close to you, or through the words and actions of people you read about or saw on TV. Remember and give thanks for the people who have helped you to greater wisdom in life. 3. The Spirit also speaks to us through 'the signs of the times'. The church has lived through a troubled decade or two, and society has been through a turbulent year with the pandemic. How do you think the Spirit is speaking to us at this time? 4. Wisdom is handed on from person to person, and from generation to generation, within families, within communities, etc. Are there any particular gems of wisdom that you cherish from what has been handed on to you? What wisdom would you like most of all to pass on to those close to you?
