## PUBLIC CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

Under the present public health guidelines we are able to have two sections of 50 persons each in our church. Section A entrance/exit is the side door facing the Parochial House and Section B entrance/exit is the church's Main Door. There can be no intermingling of the two sections. Social distancing of 2 meters within sections, wearing face masks if at all possible, and hand sanitizing are to be observed. Members of the same household can be together in seat but different households need to be 2 meters apart if in same seat. Holy Communion will continue to be distributed in the seats and on the hand. Choir is not permitted at this time. Thank you to stewards for their great assistance and to our sacristan, James, for keeping the interior of the church and all it's contents thoroughly sanitized and as well as keeping necessary supplies up to date.

**CORPUS CHRISTI:** Next Sunday we celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) As there will not be a Procession this year, a short time of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament will follow the 11am Mass and conclude with Benediction. Parishioners are invited to prepare an altar in their homes to honour the presence of the Lord and the gift of himself in the Eucharist. The altar can be a small table with a white cloth, some flowers, a cross, a bible, a statue and some prayers or some symbol of First Holy Communion for families celebrating First Eucharist this year.

## FAMILY PRAYER TIME (Loyola Press)

The Solemnity of the Holy Trinity invites us to remember that God has revealed himself to us as one God in three Persons. As Jesus departed from his disciples, he shared with them the power to make disciples of all nations. He taught his disciples to invite others to share in the life of the blessed Trinity by sharing with others the gift of Baptism. This continues to be the mission of the Church. Each of us who has been baptised shares in the life of the blessed Trinity and also shares in the Church's mission of inviting others to share in God's love. As you gather as a family, bring out pictures and other mementos of family celebrations of the Sacrament of Baptism. Talk about the significance of Baptism with your family. Read together today's Gospel, Matthew 28:16-20. Notice that Jesus taught his disciples to baptise all nations in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. What else does this remind you of? (The sign of the Cross) Recall that whenever we pray the Sign of the Cross, we are reminding ourselves that we are united with God through our Baptism and share in the life of the blessed Trinity. Conclude by thanking God for sharing his life with us. Pray together the Glory Be To The Father.

### THE MOST HOLY TRINITY 30 May 2021 - Seeing your life through the lens of the Gospel

1. It is time for Jesus to return to his Father. He meets his disciples for the last time. His final words give them direction for their future. Perhaps you can recall such parting moments in your own life - leaving home, school, college, training, the death of a loved one. What was that like for you? Were there words spoken then that gave you direction for your future? 2. Perhaps you can identify with Jesus in the story, when as a parent, teacher, or in some other way, you sent someone on his/her way in life knowing you would not be with him/her as in the past. When did the way you parted help the other to make his or her own way in life? 3. Jesus told his disciples that although he would not be with them as in the past, he would be with them in a new way right throughout their lives. Have there been times when you were reassured by the love and support of another even though he/she was not physically present with you? 4. In parting with his disciples, Jesus gave them a mission for the future. Where, when and how did you get a sense of the meaning and purpose of your own life? How does that sustain you now? Is there any way in which that purpose ties in with the mission given to the eleven to spread the Good News? 5. Jesus promised to be with his disciples until the end of time. It is a promise he would fulfil through the gift of the Holy Spirit. That promise is also given to us. What helps you to be aware of the presence of the Holy Spirit with you on life's journey?

### CHILDRENS CORNER (Sermons4Kids)

In our Gospel reading today, Jesus reminds his disciples that he has all authority over heaven and earth. He has the power to allow anyone who believes in him to enter heaven. What did Jesus tell his disciples to do in this Gospel? (He told them to teach and to make disciples of all nations; he told them to baptize in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit) Did this remind you of anything when you heard it read? (the Sign of the Cross) Whenever we make the Sign of the Cross, we remind ourselves that we became children of God at our Baptism. When we were baptized the priest, our parents and our godparents traced a cross on our foreheads. The priest also spoke the name of the Trinity - Father, Son and Holy Spirit - as we were baptized with water. In today's Gospel Jesus gave his disciples the power to baptize people everywhere in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Jesus also told his disciples to pass along the power by teaching others what he taught them. Conclude by praying to remember that we also have been given the power to teach others about Jesus through our Baptism. Pray the Glory Be To The Father.
