PUBLIC CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST

Under new Government guidelines that came into effect from 22nd Oct, 2021 churches can have congregation at full capacity with all other protective measures remaining in place. This requires not attending if having symptoms of Covid, sanitizing hands, the wearing of masks and social distancing as appropriate. Holy Communion will be distributed by coming forward to the Sanctuary area, and on the hand. Those in side aisles are requested to come forward in aisle along the wall and return by next aisle, leaving appropriate space. Those in main aisle are requested to alternate between right and left seats so that there is only a single line coming forward and to return by next aisle leaving appropriate distance between themselves and also those of side aisles returning to their seats. Masks to be worn processing for Holy Communion and returning to seats. Those in St. Joseph's Chapel are requested to come forward in the wall aisle close to the Chapel and return in the next aisle. Holy Communion will be brought to anyone for whom it is not possible to come forward. Thank you again to all stewards for their great assistance during the past year and a half, and to our sacristan James, for keeping interior of the church and all its contents thoroughly sanitized as well as keeping the necessary supplies in place.



THANK YOU: On behalf of Pope Francis, thank you for supporting World Mission Sunday. Your kindness means that overseas missionaries can continue to share the love of God with some of the world's most marginalised and vulnerable people. Your contributions provides basic infrastructure by helping communities to build schools, clinics, parish halls and churches; prepares the future leaders and carers of the Church by supporting the training of sisters, priests, brothers and catechists; supports missionary programmes to care for children's spiritual and physical wellbeing by offering safe shelter, healthcare, education and hope.

FAMILY PRAYER (Loyola Press) As Christians, our moral behaviour is guided by the two-part commandment taught by Jesus in today's Gospel: love God and love your neighbour as yourself. Many of us learned to use this framework as an examination of conscience. By examining our lives through the lens of these commandments, we have learned that the challenge of these commandments is not in our desire to follow them but in our capacity to consistently honour these commandments in our daily lives. For one week, identify and collect news reports of how Christians show their love for God by loving and serving their neighbour. Clip these news items and share what you have heard when you gather as a family. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 12:28b-34. Talk about ways in which your family might contribute to the examples of Christian service you found. Choose one of these actions to do together as a family. Conclude in prayer together, asking God to help us show love to our family members and friends. Pray the Act of Love: O my God, I love you above all things with my whole heart and soul, because you are all good and worthy of all my love. I love my neighbour as myself for the love of you. I forgive all who have injured me and I ask pardon of those whom I have injured. Amen.

SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPEL (Loyola Press) 1. Today's Gospel bring us right to the heart of what a Christian's life involves: love of God and of neighbour. Jesus tells us that having life both now and in the future is the fruit of living in a spirit of love. How have you experienced the power of love given, and received, as a source of life and vitality? 2. If you were asked what is most important in life, what would your answer be? Recall the experiences and relationships you have had. Which are the ones that you treasure most? What has particularly enriched your life? How would you encourage another person who asked you how s/he could live a full life? 3. Jesus praises the questioner as one who had answered wisely. Recall some of the wise people you have known, people who in their words and actions impressed you with their capacity to see and treasure what is important in life.

CHILDRENS CORNER (Loyola Press) Today we will learn about Jesus' commandment to love. Which commandment did Jesus say was the greatest? (You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your mind, and with all your strength) What other commandment did Jesus give? (You shall love your neighbour as yourself) This is Jesus' Great Commandment, his teaching that we are to both love God and love our neighbour as ourselves. Our neighbours aren't just the people who live close to us. Everyone is our neighbour. When we do loving things for others, we aren't just showing love for our neighbours. We are also showing our love for God and shining a light of God's love on others. Pray a prayer thanking Jesus for teaching us about love. Then pray this prayer: Jesus, help my ears to hear calls for help from far and near. Jesus, help my feet to go in the way that you will show. Jesus, help my hands to do all things loving, kind and true.
