## PUBLIC CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST

Under new Government guidelines that came into effect from 22nd Oct, 2021 churches can have congregation at full capacity with all other protective measures remaining in place. This requires not attending if having symptoms of Covid, sanitizing hands, the wearing of masks and social distancing as appropriate. Holy Communion will be distributed by coming forward to the Sanctuary area, and on the hand. Those in side aisles are requested to come forward in aisle along the wall and return by next aisle, leaving appropriate space. Those in main aisle are requested to alternate between right and left seats so that there is only a single line coming forward and to return by next aisle leaving appropriate distance between themselves and also those of side aisles returning to their seats. Masks to be worn processing for Holy Communion and returning to seats. Those in St. Joseph's Chapel are requested to come forward in the wall aisle close to the Chapel and return in the next aisle. Holy Communion will be brought to anyone for whom it is not possible to come forward. Thank you again to all stewards for their great assistance during the past year and a half, and to our sacristan James, for keeping interior of the church and all it's contents thoroughly sanitized as well as keeping the necessary supplies in place.

**PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL & FINANCE COMMITTEE** members present at the meeting on Thursday 28th October focused on the following:

**MASSSES:** Members welcomed the return of full capacity for churches but were conscious of the need that all the other protective measures be adhered to for everyone's continued safety.

**CHURCH MUSIC AND CHOIR:** Deepest appreciation was expressed to Geroge Lee for his great contribution over the years on his retirement and to all who provide music and song in church celebrations. The importance of music and song in the celebration of the Eucharist was stressed, especially as many parts of the Mass are meant to be sung. The need of new choir members was also highlighted.

**SYNOD IN ROME ON SYNODALITY 2023 AND SYNODAL PATHWAY IN IRELAND:** Fr. Eugene Duffy, Maeve Leheny and Bill Carty of the Diocesan Pastoral Leadership Team put in place by Bishop Dempsey, will co-ordinate the rolling out of the process for diocesan phase of Rome Synod which is extended to 15th August 2022. The data gathered in our own diocese will help to form the basis of our own pastoral planning for the coming years as well as contribute to the Synodal Pathway in Ireland.

**CHURCH RENOVATION:** Members agreed to renew engagement with architects in furthering needed works on the church structure.

**SAFEGUARDING SUNDAY:** Bishop Paul has issued an update on safeguarding in the diocese this weekend. Included are updated posters, information for those working with children, young people and vulnerable adults. He has also issued a letter which is available at church doors and parish facebook and website.

**FAMILY PRAYER (Loyola Press)** Today's Gospel leads us to think about our family's financial contributions to our parish community, the diocese, other Church-sponsored organisations, and other charitable organisations. Good stewardship invites us to share our treasure as well as our time and talent. Sometimes, however, decisions about a family's charitable giving are made without our children's knowledge. Yet we teach more when we invite all family members to be aware of how we contribute to our church and to other charitable organisations. As you gather as a family, talk about your family's financial contributions to your parish and to other church activities. If your family supports other charitable organisations, you might talk about these as well. Talk together about why it is important for us to share our resources with these organisations. Read Mark 12:41-44. Talk about what Jesus observes about the generosity of the poor widow. Talk about ways in which your family might also make a sacrificial gift to support your parish or other charitable organisation. (Perhaps you might choose not to go out to dinner but to contribute the money to your parish) Invite all family members to participate in the decision about what action you will take and which organisation you will support with your contribution. Conclude in prayer together, asking God to help your family be generous like the poor widow in today's Gospel. Pray: O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console, to be understood as to understand, to be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive, it is in pardoning that we are pardoned, and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. Amen.

**SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPEL (Loyola Press)** 1. The scribes are presented as ostentatious and devious, acting more out of self-interest than the love of God or people. There can be an element of self-interest in each of us. Perhaps there have been times when you have been disturbed by glimpsing in yourself 'other motives' in your doing good. Recall when you were awakened to this fact. Where was the good news for you in that awakening? 2. In material terms what the widow had to offer was very little. Recall when you felt yourself called to give and gave even though you apparently had very little. Perhaps you have had the experience of finding what you thought was little and insignificant meant a great deal to another person. Recall some of those moments. 3. At this critical moment for the church Pope Francis has called a synod and has invited all believers to make a contribution. It's easy for us to see this as a call to professional church people, clergy and religious. They have always taken care of this kind of thing. Now the call is that the voices of the little ones can also be heard. How can you help this to happen in your church community?

**CHILDRENS CORNER (Loyola Press)** Sometimes being generous involves making a sacrifice. Ask: Do you think it is more generous to give away an old toy we don't play with any more or a new toy that we like? (a new toy) Why? (We probably don't care to think much about the old toy, but giving up the new toy would be hard because we like and use it.) In today's Gospel, we hear about a woman who was generous. People who were rich gave a lot of money. However, Jesus called attention to someone else's generosity. Whose generosity did Jesus acknowledge? (the widows) The widow gave only two small coins, but her contribution was greater because she gave everything that she had. She trusted God to provide for her. We are called to be generous like the widow. Many of us can feel that we have little to give to a world that has so many problems. As he did with the widow, Jesus is telling us that what is most important to God is to give what we have with a generous heart. Thank God for all he has given you, ask him to help you to be generous like the widow. Pray: Glory be to the Father.
