PUBLIC CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

Under the present public health guidelines we are able to have two sections of 50 persons each in our church. Section A entrance/exit is the side door facing the Parochial House and Section B entrance/exit is the church's Main Door. There can be no intermingling of the two sections. Social distancing of 2 meters within sections, wearing face masks if at all possible, and hand sanitizing are to be observed. Members of the same household can be together in seat but different households need to be 2 meters apart if in same seat. Holy Communion will continue to be distributed in the seats and on the hand. Choir is not permitted at this time. Thank you to stewards for their great assistance and to our sacristan, James, for keeping the interior of the church and all its contents thoroughly sanitized and as well as keeping necessary supplies up to date.

SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPEL (Intercom)

1. Jesus gave the disciples a share in his mission by sending them out ahead of him. It was a gesture of trust and confidence on his part, even though they did not fully understand his mission. Have you ever been surprised by the trust shown in you by others to speak or act on their behalf?
2. Jesus sent the disciples out two by two. Perhaps your experience gives you examples of the value of having another with you when engaged in an important task.

3. The apparently strange instructions given by Jesus were intended to counteract practices by bogus preachers who used preaching as a mask for money-making. True disciples of Jesus focus on the mission and not on their own comforts. Is it your experience that vested interests can impede a task, whereas having the right motives make your mission more effective?

4. The task of the disciples was to call people to repent, (metanoia = conversion, change the way we look at God and at other people). Who have been the disciples, the people in your life, who have called you to be more trusting in God? To whom have you given this call?

LITURGY AND LIFE

The Church has a vital role to play in shaping responsible citizens with moral character and a willingness to contribute to the well-being of society. Every Mass ends with the mission to go forth and serve the Lord. This sending means that the love of God and neighbour and the moral implications of the Beatitudes and the Ten Commandments should be witnessed by the participants in everyday life. People of faith know that their liturgical experience provides a unique spiritual vision and strength for making this a better world. The saints who have fostered human dignity in every age, attribute their remarkable energies to the power that comes from prayer and above all from the sacraments, especially the Eucharist.

CHILDRENS CORNER (LOYOLA PRESS)

What makes playing a team sport fun? In today's Gospel, we hear how Jesus sent his disciples to minister in his name. What did Jesus send his disciples to do? (to preach and to heal the sick). Did Jesus send them out alone? (No, he sent them out in pairs) Jesus wants us to tell people about his love for us and to help people in his name. But he doesn't expect us to do this job alone. He wants us to work with others. The Church is the community of disciples who teach people about Jesus and who helps others in his name. Through Baptism, we became members of the Church. Jesus seemed to know the value of teamwork, and he thought it was so important that he made it one of the 'rules' of Christian ministry. As Jesus' disciples today, we too are sent to share Jesus' message with others. But we are not sent alone because we have the community of the Church, which supports us in our life of Christian disciples.



FAMILY PRAYER TIME (Loyola Press)

Families who work together to accomplish routine household tasks know that the benefits are more than efficiency. In sharing daily tasks, we accomplish more, but we also build relationships that last - and it's a lot more fun! Jesus sent his disciples in pairs to minister in his name. Perhaps the job was accomplished more effectively this way, but more importantly, Jesus' mission was accomplished more authentically. The Christian message can only authentically be proclaimed in and through the community of faith. In our work with others, we build this community of faith and can invite others to share in it. As you gather as a family, talk about some household tasks that are more easily accomplished when two or more people work together. Talk about how working together not only makes the job easier, but also makes the task more fun because we are able to spend time together. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 6:7-13. Ask: Why do you think Jesus sent out his disciples in pairs? Observe that Jesus continues to give us a community with which we share our life of discipleship - our family and the community of the Church. Conclude in prayer together that we will continue to rely on the support of the community of the Church in our life of discipleship. Pray together the Prayer of the Holy Spirit. *Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created, and you will renew the face of the earth. Lord, by the light of the Holy Spirit, you have taught the hearts of your faithful. In the same Spirit, help us to relish what is right and always rejoice in your consolation. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.*
