## PUBLIC CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

Under the present public health guidelines we are able to have two sections of 50 persons each in our church. Section A entrance/exit is the side door facing the Parochial House and Section B entrance/exit is the church's Main Door. There can be no intermingling of the two sections. Social distancing of 2 meters within sections, wearing face masks if at all possible, and hand sanitizing are to be observed. Members of the same household can be together in seat but different households need to be 2 meters apart if in same seat. Holy Communion will continue to be distributed in the seats and on the hand. Choir is not permitted at this time. Thank you to stewards for their great assistance and to our sacristan, James, for keeping the interior of the church and all it's contents thoroughly sanitized and as well as keeping necessary supplies up to date.

## WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY

Pope Francis has established a World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, which will take place for the first time on Sunday 25th July, 2021 on the theme 'I am with you always' (Mt. 28:20). In his theme chosen for this inaugural year 'I am with you always', the Holy Father is highlighting that promise of closeness that generations share with each other. Not only are our young people called to be present in the lives of older people, but so too grandparents and elders have a mission to encourage young people on their faith journey. Our little domestic churches are always enriched by the inclusion of grandparents and elders. Plenary Indulgence is granted for this day to grandparents, elderly, those who visit the elderly in person or virtually and all who participate in a true spirit of penance and charity. ## SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPEL- 16TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

1. The apostles reported to Jesus all that they had done and taught. Perhaps you have had the experience of being able to check in with somebody and share an experience. What was that like for you?
2. Jesus saw that the apostles needed to rest and eat. What has been your experience of finding a restful place after a busy day? What kind of nourishment have you found necessary in order to maintain energy and enthusiasm? Did your experience during the Covid 19 pandemic give you any new insights about this?
3. When Jesus saw the crowd, he recognised their need and reached out to them. Who has been a Jesus person for you, someone who recognised your need and reached out to you? For whom have you been a Jesus person in that way?
4. It sometimes can be difficult to strike a balance between responding to the needs of others and meeting our need for rest and nourishment. What has helped you to keep the balance right? (Intercom)

### CHILDRENS CORNER (LOYOLA PRESS)

Each day we are busy doing many good and fun activities. At the end of the day, we are tired and need time to rest. What are some of the things you do at the end of the day to help you rest? (quiet time with family, reading, listening to quiet music, praying, and so on). In today's Gospel we learn that Jesus and his disciples also needed to find time to rest after a busy day. Let's listen carefully to this Gospel. What does Jesus want to do with his disciples? (He wanted to go away from the crowds and rest.) Are they able to do this? (No, the crowds follow them) Jesus knew that his disciples were tired, and he wanted to spend some quiet time with them. But they weren't able to do that on this day because the crowd's kept following them. Jesus also wants to spend quiet time with us, and he invites us to do this in our prayer. Now that Jesus is with God in heaven, he is able to be with us whenever we pray. As we settle in at the end of the day, we can spend time with Jesus in prayer.

### FAMILY PRAYER TIME (Loyola Press)

Family demands can make us feel like Jesus and the twelve apostles. We wish for times of relaxation and renewal, but there are errands to do, household chores to keep up with, volunteer commitments to keep. These are all good things, but we can be left feeling drained and tired as we try to keep up. Perhaps we might take the opportunity this week to give ourselves permission to find the rest and relaxation that Jesus seeks for his disciples in today's Gospel. One of the gifts we can give to one another in our family life is assistance in finding the time and space to renew ourselves through prayer. When you gather together as a family this week, bring your family calendar. Together review your family calendar and spend some time reflecting on your family activities. In particular, ask if your family has an appropriate amount of time for rest and relaxation. If not, discuss ways in which this time for renewal might be included in the week ahead. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 6:30-34. Notice how Jesus tried to find time and space for his disciples to rest and relax after they returned from their mission. Conclude in prayer together, asking God to help us find time to renew ourselves so that we might be better disciples of Jesus. Pray together the Lord's Prayer.
