St Patrick, Bishop, Missionary. Born in Britain probably in the early years of the fifth century, taken captive at the age of 16 and brought to Ireland, where he worked as a slave. His captivity led him to a renewal of his spiritual life. After he escaped back home at the age of 22, it was clear to him that God was calling him to return to convert the Irish. After studies in Europe he returned to Ireland, where he made a very large number of converts. His spiritual journey is recounted in his Confessio.

Children's Corner (Loyola Press) – As Christians, we are called to think about the needs of others. In today's Gospel, Jesus talks about the great sacrifice he will make for all of us. He invites us to think of others before ourselves. Jesus knew that he was going to die. But he did not pray for God to save him from death. He knew that God had sent him to save us from sin. Jesus put the needs of the world before his own life. He was willing to die to save us from our sins and offer us eternal life in heaven with God the Father. Jesus calls us to serve others by putting their needs before our own. That means that we think about what others might need and help them, even when it may not be what we want to do. We show our love for Jesus and thank him for his great sacrifice for us by caring for one another. Pray that Jesus help us be his loving like him. Then pray the Sign of the Cross.

Family Prayer Time (Loyola Press) – Family life is often a balancing act in which we prioritize and attend to a variety of competing needs. We learn the value of putting others' needs ahead of our own. In family life we also learn that when we make personal sacrifices to serve others, we gain so much more than we may have lost. As you gather as a family, talk about how important it is to your family life to gladly serve one another. Ask each person to consider the last time that another family member asked for help. What was your response? Did you cheerfully try to honor the request, or did you ask "Why me?" Read today's Gospel, John 12:20-33. How do you think Jesus would want us to respond when someone in our family asks for help? Invite each family member to make a commitment for the next week to try to respond cheerfully to requests for help. Pray together, asking God's help with this commitment. Our Father......

Seeing your Life through the Lens of the Gospel; – John 12: 20-30 – 1) The parable of the grain of wheat reminds us of a truth that any parent can testify to, namely that it is dying to ourselves that we can give life to others. We will never be of benefit to others, if we remain wrapped up in ourselves. In what ways has your dying to yourself brought life to another? How has the generous giving of another brought life to you? 2) Sometimes our emotions rebel at the thought of what lies ahead, and we feel like praying Father, save me from this hour. Then a realisation may come for you as a parent, a teacher, a spouse, a friend: No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Recall times when you have accepted pain or hassle and been a source of life to others for doing do. 3) The story presents the death of Jesus as the moment of his glorification by God. We are also glorified when the grace of God enables us to give generously of ourselves. When have you experienced this in yourself or in another? 4) This voice has come for your sake and not for mine. The angel spoke that we might recognise the love being shown us by Jesus. Sometimes it requires the voice of another to draw our attention to love that is being offered to us. When was this your experience?
